Format

In these unprecedented times, the format of the 'Aha Pae'aina will be different. While we will miss being together in-person, sharing ono meals and talking story, we will make the most of this opportunity to "be together" in different ways.

The 'Aha Pae'aina will start at 3:00pm on Sunday, October, 4, with a Conference-wide worship service. The various 'Aha Iki meetings will be held Monday – Thursday. The Formation Missional Team will be planning workshops, free for anyone to attend, interspersed throughout the week. The 'Aha will end with the Makua business session on Saturday and a closing worship. All of this will take place online.

Registration

• All who attend must register by 4:00pm September 23, 2020. One form for each registrant and full payment (\$25 per person) must be postmarked no later than September 23, if sending in via USPS, to guarantee your registration. Online registration will close at 4:00pm on September 23, 2020.

- No Late Registration will be accepted due to the need to upload registrant
 information prior to connecting; all such information must be submitted by the
 registration deadline.
- **Retired Ordained Clergy** with standing in an association of the Hawai'i Conference may have 'Aha Makua fees waived.

Meeting Information

Business

Each delegate will be asked to vote on important issues and therefore it is vitally important for your church's delegate(s) to familiarize themselves with information about the business items. Voting Delegates

To be a voting delegate, you must be in one of these categories:

- 1. Local churches with standing in an association of the Hawai'i Conference are entitled to:
 - a. **One lay delegate** for the first 200 members and an additional delegate for each 100 members or major fraction thereof, up to a *maximum of five*. (For example, a church with 251 members is entitled to two delegates: one lay delegate for the first 200 members plus one lay delegate for the major fraction [51] above 200. (Note that the number of church members is determined by 2020 UCC Yearbook listing.)
 - b. One youth/young adult delegate, 30 years of age or younger.
- 2. **Ordained, Licensed, or Commissioned ministers** with current standing in an association of the Hawai'i Conference.
- 3. Members of Hawai'i Conference Council and Chairs of standing and special committees.
- 4. **Presidents of Associations and Recognized Affiliate Organizations** (Woman's Board of Missions, State Sunday School Association, Christian Endeavor Association, State Council of Hawaiian Congregational Churches, Council of Samoan Churches, Hawai'i Pacific Islander and Asian American Ministries, and UCC Transition House).
