Centering Words (John 19)

Tonight, we find ourselves surrounded by the darkness of an invisible virus. Tonight, we remember when LOVE entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, is now on this cross – crucified like a common criminal. Because those who once shouted "Hosana in the Highest" are now shouting "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" Darkness is falling. Our journey ends here, at the foot of your cross. Our journey ends where love comes to die. (Strike the Tibetan Bowl three times)

Let us Open our Worship with Our Call to Worship (John 19)

Rong: When we are lost and lonely,

Many: Jesus, remember me.

Rong: When worry threatens to crush our spirits,

Many: Jesus, remember me.

Rong: When our words wound the people we love,

Many: Jesus, remember me.

Rong: When we treat others with contempt and disdain,

Many: Jesus, remember me.

Rong: When we come into God's kingdom,

ALL: Jesus, remember me. Welcome me home.

Lord, our journey ends here, at the foot of the cross. Darkness is falling. The crowd is restless. Our hearts break, as your cries pierce the night. Stay with us, Lord, for we need you close at hand. And when the night is over and the journey continues, give us the courage to stay with you. Amen,

Litany of Confession (*Isa 53, John 19*)

Pastor Tino: Surely, he has borne our infirmities and carried our iniquities.

Many: I am the one who held the nails.

Rong: We accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted.

Many: I am the one who raised the hammer.

Pastor Tino: But he was wounded for our transgressions.

Many: I am the one who rolled the dice.

Rong: He was crushed for our iniquities.

Many: I am the one who pointed and laughed.

Pastor Tino: Upon him was laid the punishment that made us whole.

Many: I am the one for whom he died.

Rong: By his bruises, we are healed.

ALL: When I know not what I do, do not withhold your love, for we long to be made whole.

God's Assurance to Us (Heb 10)

Even as he hung on the cross, Jesus spoke words of love. To the thief, to his tormentors, to a world of sinners, our Lord says: "I will remember your sins no more." For us, Jesus carried that cross. For us, Jesus bled and died. For us, Jesus spoke words of love. For us, Jesus hears our call against this unforgiving virus. For us, Jesus offers forgiveness and grace.

Proclamation and Response

(Place seven candles on the altar. After each word, scripture, and response is read, extinguish one candle. It is powerful to accompany the extinguishing of each candle with the ringing of a single bell and a slight darkening of the sanctuary or worship space. The sayings of Jesus are adaptations; the response is Isa 53:6 NRSV.)

Tenebrae Liturgy

FIRST WORD: "Creator, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Luke 23:32-38

Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Creator, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and

saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

John 19:23-27

When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them into four parts, one for each soldier. They also took his tunic; now the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from the top. So they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see who will get it." This was to fulfill what the scripture says, "They divided my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots." And that is what the soldiers did. Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him."

And when all the crowds who had gathered there for this spectacle saw what had taken place, they returned home, beating their breasts. But all his acquaintances, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things.
